



1. MUCHO / MUCHA / MUCHOS / MUCHAS

These all mean "a lot of" or "many", and we use them with things (nouns).

It changes depending on:

If the thing is a boy word (masculine: el) or girl word (feminine: la),

And if it's one or more than one.



Let's look at examples:

Word	Use it with...	Example	Meaning
MUCHO	1 boy thing (masculine)	Hay mucho chocolate.	There is a lot of chocolate.
MUCHA	1 girl thing (feminine)	Hay mucha agua.	There is a lot of water.
MUCHOS	many boy things	Hay muchos gatos.	There are many cats.
MUCHAS	many girl things	Hay muchas flores.	There are many flowers.

 Think:

o = boy word

a = girl word

s = more than one!

 2. MUY

MUY means "very" and goes with describing words (adjectives).

Example	Meaning
Ella es muy bonita.	She is very pretty.
Estoy muy feliz.	I am very happy.
El perro es muy grande.	The dog is very big.



So remember:

MUY is for how something is (very happy, very fast, very tall).

MUCHO and friends are for how much of something (a lot of cake, many dogs).



Mini Trick to Remember:

If you're counting things, use MUCHO / MUCHA / MUCHOS / MUCHAS.

If you're describing feelings or size, use MUY.
